	Implementation of theT2 plan will include generation of (1) a research article that will be submitted to a peer reviewed journal and (2) a podcast that will summarize the research findings for audiences that are interested in the results, but not apt to read a traditional research report. The T2 plan will also involve hosting a research summit with participants from the research panel, TNC representatives, BVI experts, technology experts, and BVI rehabilitators.
Impacts/Benefits of Implementation (actual, not anticipated)	The research team anticipates that the findings will help inform the general body of research concerning travel safety of the BVI population. Furthermore, the research will be of significant interest to both TNCs and TNC researchers, as these services have only

	recently come into being(within the last 10 years), yet have impacted travel behavior landscape quite dramatically.
